"Give, and it shall be given unto you.....For with the same measure, that you give, it shall be given unto you."

Luke 6:38 (interpretation with easy words)

What do you remember about people?
That they were kind, generous, giving,
understanding.

Or that they were mean, complained,
not friendly, not giving or generous.

The Bible verse tells us to give—be generous.
Someday when we need it—others will give to
us. If we have been generous—others will
remember and be generous to us.

If we have not bothered to give to others—they
probably will not give to us.



Promises From the Bible

"For if you forgive men their trespasses,
your heavenly Father will also forgive you;
but if you forgive not men their trespasses,
neither will your heavenly Father forgive
your trespasses." Matthew 6:14,15

Trespasses—sins against God or against us.
We want God to forgive our sins. Jesus said that
God will forgive us— if we are willing to forgive
those who sin against us.

Someone may have done a very bad sin against you.
You may think you can never forgive them.

Tell God how you feel. Ask Him to help you forgive.
Give God that hurt—their sin against you. Give it to
God to take care of. Let him see to that person.

Ask God to take away your bitter feelings and give
you peace.

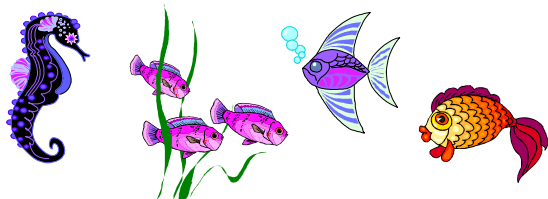
Promises From the Bible

Counsel—advice, direction
